- Save your students time and make sure they find the correct resource by using direct links.
- Copy the link from the search bar and paste it where your students can access it.
- As long as they're logged in to World Book, students can be taken straight to the intended resource.

Primary Sources:

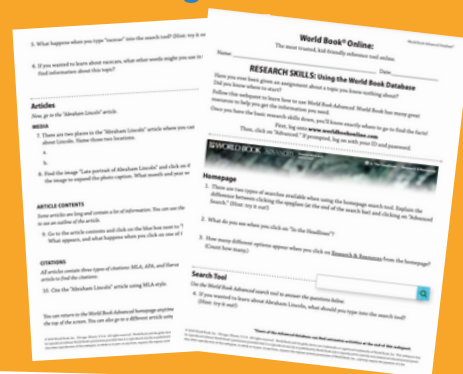
Find primary sources listed in the Related Information tab in correlated Advanced articles.

Educator Tools:

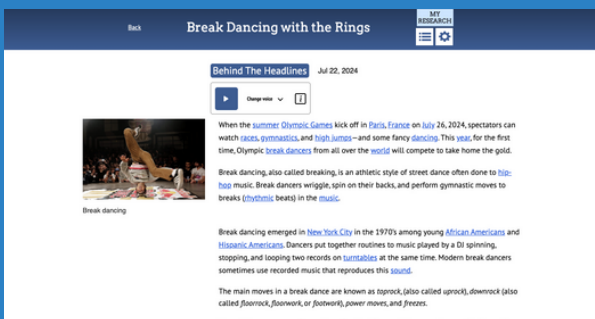
