# **LESSON PLAN**

Using World Book Online

**SUBJECT:** Social Studies

#### **GRADE LEVEL: 3rd**

#### **STANDARDS:**

- SS.G.1.3. Locate major landforms and bodies of water on a map or other representation.
- SS.G.2.3. Compare how people modify and adapt to the environment and culture in our community to other places.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

 Students will be able to write a shape poem comparing and contrasting their community and culture to Mexico's.

# **ACTIVITIES**

#### **DAY 1:**

 Students will build background knowledge by completing the WebQuest, "Get to Know: Mexico."

### **DAY 2:**

 Jigsaw: have students read the articles <u>Mexico</u> and <u>United States</u>, then share what they've learned with the group. Use the <u>More</u> <u>Information</u> tab for questions to guide discussion. <u>Related articles</u> can be used to learn more about the cultures of each country.

#### **DAY 3:**

 Adapt this activity to map Mexico and the US. Print the related Outline Maps & Flags, have students color the flags of each country and label major landmarks.

- Latin America
- Pacific Ocean
- Gulf of Mexico
- Mestizo
- Indigenous

#### **MATERIALS:**

- Laptops or Chromebooks for access to World Book Kids
- Printed outline maps of the US and Mexico- from <u>Outline Maps & Flags</u>
- Large sheets of paper
- · Crayons, colored pencils, or markers

#### DAY 4:

Students will use the <u>Compare</u>
<u>Places</u> feature to compare and
contrast Mexico to the United
<u>States</u>.

#### **DAY 5:**

 Students will write a letter to a pen pal in Mexico, telling them about our community and asking them about theirs.

# **ASSESSMENT**

Students will write a <u>shape poem</u> comparing and contrasting their community to what they've learned about Mexico in the shape of Mexico.
